We are excited about the opportunity to work and learn together, to develop a larger circle and to share the workload. We wanted to let you know about us, so that when initiatives are presented you know that they are part of a coordinated effort. Our objectives are:

1. Continue building relationships

- with local Indigenous organizations we already support such as <u>The Healing of the</u> <u>Seven Generations</u> (H7G) at 300 Frederick St, and <u>Crow Shield Lodge</u> who have a site at Doon Heritage Village..
- With <u>Nations Uniting</u> and fellow United Church members in Six Nations churches.

2. Learning and better understanding

- Indigenous cultures
- Our history and the church's role in the past and in our future
- 3. Action to move forward as we learn what it means to Live Into Right Relations

At this point our plans include:

Oct 4 - Day trip to Nations Uniting on Six Nations to learn about what they do from coordinator Rhonda Johns. Future plans include the hope to host a Kairos Blanket Exercise to help us better understand what happened between European settlers and Indigenous peoples and their land.

We pray that our Church Councils will encourage these initiatives and we look forward to working together.
